Guidelines for Submission of Papers

- 1. The title page should contain the title of the paper, the author (s) name (s) with surname in capital letters, functional mail address, valid e-mail address, and WhatsApp phone number (s).
- 2. Abstract should not be more than 200 words with 3-5 keywords typed on a separate sheet and in a single line spacing.

- 3. The paper should be typed on A4 sized paper using Times New Romans font 12 with 1.15 line spacing, and not exceeding 15 pages including the main text, tables, figures and references.
- 4. The author should follow the APA style (7th edition) for in-text citations and referencing style.
- 5. The paper should be properly organized under appropriate subheadings for theoretical papers; showing introduction and review of current literature. And for empirical studies, the article should show Introduction, Statement of the Problem, Objectives, Questions/Hypotheses, Results, Discussions, Recommendations and Conclusion.
- 6. Submission should be done at least four (4) week to the publication date
