These must be attested to in a signed copyright form accompanying the paper.
- ii. All manuscripts should be prepared in MS-Word 2007 format and submitted online to: **lajomasibbul2020@gmail.com**
- iii. Standard length of a paper must not be more than 6,500 words with double line spacing including the abstract, figures, tables, references and appendixes.
- iv. The content of the paper should reflect title, author's name(s), full address, email, phone number(s) and abstract with 250 words as well as 5 keywords.
- v. The text should be double line spacing throughout with minimum of 1 inch for left and right hand margin. Also, 1 inch for head and foot margin. Text should be standard of 12 font size- Times New Roman.
- vi. APA 6<sup>th</sup> edition reference style is recommended. All author(s) cited in the body of the paper must appear in the reference. Reference should be arranged in alphabetical order with surname of the author(s) coming first before the initials.
- vii. The manuscripts submitted for publication in the LAJOMAS must be accompany with a non-refundable fee of ₦6,000. Accepted paper or article for publication attracts ₦20,000 only.
